### About This School

Winchester Elementary School is located six miles southwest of Hemet in Winchester, California. Tradition is evident at Winchester Elementary School. There are many second and third generation families who have attended W.E.S.. The first two-story school was built in 1884 on three acres in Pleasant Valley. Since that time the site has moved and several buildings have been constructed, which currently allows for our expected growth in student population.

We have a highly motivated and skilled group of teachers. Many of our teachers have master's degrees and others with multiple teaching credentials and supplemental authorizations. We have outstanding and supportive parents who take the education of their children very seriously and are willing to get involved to help improve our school. Our District administration and Governing Board consistently work to support the school staff in maintaining a high level of program effectiveness. As a result of this unity, W.E.S. was recognized by the State of California as a Title I Achieving School in 2003-2004 school year.

Winchester Elementary School maintains a positive learning climate. It is staffed with goal driven, proactive, and compassionate teachers who seek out resources within the school and parent community to create an environment that allows for, "Success for Every Student."

### School Facilities (2008-09)

#### Summary of the Most Recent Site Inspection:

The district takes great efforts to ensure that all schools are clean, safe, and functional. To assist in this effort, the district uses a facility survey instrument developed by the State of California Office of Public School Construction. The results of this survey are available at the school office or at the district office.

On April 8, 2008 a site visit was conducted at Winchester Elementary School. Based on the field observations the following was found:

#### Repairs Needed:

- One classroom HVAC not operable.
- Five classrooms adjust safety screens to latch; adjust south window in one classroom to open.
- Several classrooms stained/loose ceiling tiles; clean around HVAC vents in three classrooms; one classroom carpet badly stained; stain in new carpet.
- Fire alarm has "trouble" light on in admin/teacher lounge.
- Admin/teacher lounge women's restroom bulb out; several other classrooms light fixtures out; one boy's restroom hand dryer inoperable.
- One classroom evidence of rodents.
- Adjust drinking fountains in three classrooms; one drinking fountain needs to be attached/tightened.
- Spitwads on walls and ceiling in boy's restroom.
- Possible roofs leaking in several classrooms.
- Asphalt uneven, tripping hazard.
- Two classrooms need better cleaning overall; one boy's restroom smelled/dirty; one classroom cobwebs and smells musty.

#### Corrective Actions Planned or Taken:

The district has taken the appropriate action to repair all deficiencies.
