ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

Bautista Creek Elementary School

- Monday- Wearing Red to School (Students receive their Red Ribbon Week bracelets)
- Tuesday- Students “Socking It Drugs” (miss match sock day and students make their *Say No To Drugs Pledge*)
- Wednesday- “Don’t Monkey Around with Drugs” (wear brown, bring a monkey, and students receive *Say No to Drugs* bookmarks)
- Thursday- Camouflage at the Site Against Drugs (wear camouflage clothing and school assembly entitled, “Animal Healthy Living, a Say No to Drugs Show”)
- Friday: “Say Boo to Drugs” (Story Book Character Parade and students receive a reflective trick or treat mylar bag with Say No to Drugs messages. Bautista Creek’s student-made Red Ribbon Week video will be presented to the whole school through B.C.T.V.)

Cawston Elementary School

- Monday: “Wear Red” Day – wear as much red as you can. Red wristbands provided by SDFS
- Tuesday: “Shade out Drugs” Day –Students may bring their sunglasses to wear
- Wednesday: “Lei off Drugs” Day – wear your Hawaiian clothes; Leis provided by PTA
- Thursday: “Sock it to Drugs” Day –Wear your craziest socks to show your support.
- Friday: Annual Cawston Storybook Characters Parade, including a classroom banner. Theme : “Drugs are not a fairy tale”, “Say Boo to Drugs” lollipops provided by SDFS
- Special CCTV presentation
- 1- Upper and 1- Lower grade class with the most wristbands on will be given a reward.
- The teachers will help support and inform the students about the dangers and effects of drugs and alcohol abuse.
- PTA will be sponsoring a BMX assembly with an anti-drug theme.

Hamilton School K-8

All week:

Say No to Drugs Awareness all week long through classroom-based discussions and writing assignments

Idyllwild School

- Monday: *Red Rally Day*. Students are encouraged to wear the most creative red outfits they can design. Prizes for top creativity in each class. School will be decorated with ribbons and slogans by middle school students; red ribbons will be worn all week (Principal will wear an oversized ribbon). Drug education worksheets available for all grade levels.
- Tuesday: *Drugs Turn You Inside Out*. Students will wear shirts inside out and receive stickers with the slogan of the day. BMX assembly on middle field.
- Wednesday: *Hugs, Not Drugs*. Elementary students will bring their favorite stuffed animal or a picture of their family to hug. Door decorating contest for whole school with a drug-free message, to be judged by PTA. 6th grade classes will view “Natural High” video.
- Thursday: *Hand in Hand Let’s Take a Stand*. Each class makes a commitment chain by linking red strands of construction paper; teachers will discuss the role of positive peer influence in avoiding drug use. Commitment wall will be made on an exterior school wall. Each class will contribute red hand prints to make a school wide statement that says “Hand in Hand Idyllwild School is Committed to Being Drug, Alcohol, and Tobacco-Free!”
- Friday: *Say Boo to Drugs*. Students are encouraged to continue to wear red ribbons. Costume parade at school displaying ribbons and costumes. Classes are invited to create a spooky slogan.

Jacob Wiens Elementary

- Monday: Each student receives a bracelet. Each teacher will cut out a ribbon shaped piece of butcher paper to put up on their classroom door. The students will draw pictures or write short paragraphs on positive alternatives to drugs, alcohol and tobacco
- Tuesday: Each student receives a Red Ribbon Week pencil. Each class will select an anti-drug slogan and make a poster collage. Students may use whatever grade-level appropriate resources the teacher makes available to them, for example, magazine clippings.
- Wednesday: Wear red day. Students who wear red receive a Red Ribbon Week lollipop. Classes may begin work on a class poem, song, chant or skit to perform for the rest of the grade level on Friday.
- Thursday: Classroom activities including role-playing, sidewalk art, etc. Classes may practice their poem, chant, song or skit to perform for their grade level on Friday.
- Friday: Red Ribbon Day. Students who take the “Say No to Drugs” pledge receive their Red Ribbon Week ribbon. Additional activities include grade level assemblies with classes performing poems and chants for the other classes in their grade level.

Little Lake Elementary

- Theme: “I Tune Out Drugs”
- Oct. 27-31st (Note change on master calendar please)
- Monday: distribute bracelets from PTA
- Tuesday: distribute ribbons from PTA
- Wednesday: distribute pencils from PTA
- Thursday: Door competition! Distribute book marks

- Friday: Crazy Hair Day, BBQ at lunch

- Different theme about drug awareness and drug prevention each day of the week
